



# Foxhall Farm Cup Team Chase

Sunday, March 15, 2026

Post Time 11 AM

## Conditions

1. Catch weights. Approximately three and one half miles over a flagged course. NO SCHOOLING PERMITTED.
2. Open to teams of three horses and riders representing a hunt. While steeplechase teams are invited and encouraged to participate, **ONLY TEAMS THAT HAVE FAIRLY HUNTED THE CURRENT SEASON WITH AN ORGANIZED PACK OF HOUNDS WILL BE ELIGIBLE TO WIN THE FOXHALL CUP.** Teams in contention for the cup should designate their entry as “contender”, and be prepared to provide verification of eligibility from a master if requested. This race is to encourage everyone to have fun riding cross country as well as to introduce young horses and riders to point-to-point races. All Junior riders completing the course will be recognized and a prize for the fastest junior will be awarded.
3. Protective vests, approved helmets, and overgirths are recommended. Teams that fail to negotiate the flagged course will be disqualified.
4. Teams will start separately at three-minute intervals and will race against the clock. Teams enter either the Foxhall fast time event to compete for the Foxhall Farm Trophy or in the Full Cry averaged time event. The Full Cry Trophies will be awarded separately to the Junior and Senior teams coming closest to having the average of all times over the course. All three members of each team must finish, having jumped all flagged fences. The time will be counted when the team's third horse and rider cross the finish line. The fast time teams will be assigned start times prior to those of the Full Cry Trophy competitors.
5. Each team shall designate a Team Leader. The Team Leader will be responsible for (1) making the team entry through the Central Entry Office (including a mandatory and binding declaration as to which hunt that team represents); (2) paying the team's entry fee; (3) making sure all team members appear with proof of medical coverage to sign the insurance release; (4) picking up and distributing pinnies to team members, and (5) returning pinnies. The Team Leader will be the contact person for the team.
6. Visit [www.cheshirehuntconservancy.org](http://www.cheshirehuntconservancy.org) for the course map.
7. Entries will be received by the Central Entry Office. Entries must include the name of the hunt represented, “contender” status, and intended division: Foxhall Farm Trophy (Fast) or Full Cry Trophy (Average; Junior or Senior). Juniors under 16 should be noted. All entries must be acceptable to the Committee and the Committee has the right to refuse any entry.

8. Entry fees must be paid and releases executed online by Wednesday, March 11 at 5:00 pm. Releases may be found at: [www.cheshirehuntconservancy.org](http://www.cheshirehuntconservancy.org). All entries, including those that scratch after the deadline, will be held responsible for their entry fees.
9. All horses must be on the grounds no later than a half-hour prior to Post Time. Any horse deemed late to the start may be scratched.

# The Seventy-Ninth Running of The Cheshire Races

Sunday, March 29, 2026

Plantation Field – Unionville, PA

- **RACE 1 – WORK TO RIDE SMALL PONY RACE** - Post time 10:30 AM. Open to ponies 12.2 hands and under. Children under 13 years as of January 1, 2026. Catch weights. May combine with Medium and Large pony races. About ¼ mile on the turf. **Trophy to the winner.**
- **RACE 2 – MEDIUM PONY RACE** – Post Time 10:45 AM. Open to ponies 12.3 to 13.2 hands. Children under 16 years as of January 1, 2026. Catch weights. May combine with Small and Large pony races. About 3/8 mile on the turf. **Trophy to the winner.**
- **RACE 3 – RED RAVEN LARGE PONY RACE** – Post Time 11:00 AM. Open to ponies 13.3 to 14.2 hands. Children under 16 years as of January 1, 2026. Catch weights. May combine with Small and Medium pony races. About ½ mile on the turf. **Trophy to the winner.**
- **RACE 4 – LEAD LINE PONY RACE** - Post time 11:15 AM. For ponies ridden by juniors who have not reached their 7<sup>th</sup> birthday as of January 1, 2026. All ponies must have a lead line attached to their bridle and must be accompanied by an adult. About 50 yds. Walk or trot; entries breaking from trot must go behind the last entry in the field before continuing or may be Disqualified. Riders must wear ASTM approved helmets, overgirths and protective vests are highly encouraged. Racing silks encouraged, riding attire accepted. **Trophy to the winner.**
- **RACE 5 – THE MRS. MILES VALENTINE MEMORIAL SIDE SADDLE RACE** - Post time 12:00 PM. Approximately 1 mile over fair hunting country. ~~Riders and horses to follow behind field master to allotted point then released to race to the finish.~~ **Trophy to the winner, highest placed Thoroughbred. Prize for Best Turned Out (judged in paddock).**
- **RACE 6 – THE JOSEPH WALKER, III MEMORIAL CHESHIRE BOWL (Sanctioned) - Purse \$20,000. Open Timber.** Post Time 12:30 PM. For Five Year Olds and Upward. Five Year Olds, 165 lbs; older, 170 lbs. Non-winners of a timber stakes, allowed 5 lbs; of a race over timber, 10 lbs. **About Three miles over timber.**
- **RACE 7 – THE LOUIS NEILSON, III MEMORIAL APPRENTICE RIDER TIMBER (Sanctioned) – Purse \$15,000. Timber.** Post time 1:00 PM. For Five Year Olds and Upward which have not won a timber or hurdle stakes in 2025. To be ridden by apprentice riders. 170 lbs. Non-winners of two races over timber, allowed 5 lbs.; of a race, 10 lbs. Riders who have never won a race allowed 5 lbs. No other rider allowances. **About Three miles over timber.**
- **RACE 8 – THE ASHWELL STABLE MAIDEN TIMBER (Sanctioned) – Purse \$15,000. Timber.** Post Time 1:30 PM. For Five Year Olds and Upward who have never won over timber. Five year olds, 160 lbs; older, 165 lbs. **About Three miles over timber.**
- **RACE 9 – THE RAINBOWS FOR LUCK MAIDEN TIMBER (Sanctioned) – Purse \$15,000. Timber.** Post Time 2:00 PM. For Five Year Olds and Upward who have never won over timber. Five year olds, 160 lbs; older, 165 lbs. **About Three miles over timber.**
- **RACE 10 - THE MRS. P.F.N. FANNING MEMORIAL NOVICE TIMBER** - Post time 2:30 PM. Novice Timber. Open to horses that have never won over timber prior to 1/1/26. Open to all riders, minimum weight 165 lbs. Apprentice rider allowances will be given. **About Three miles over timber.**
- **SUBSTITUTE RACE 10 - ALLOWANCE TIMBER** - Open to horses aged 5 and up that have not won over timber in 2025 or 2026. Open to all riders, minimum weight 165 lbs. Apprentice rider allowances will be given. **About Three miles over timber.**
- **RACE 11 – THE RAFORD BOY OPEN FLAT RACE – Open Flat.** Post time 3:00 PM. Three Year Olds, 150 lbs. Four Year Olds and Up, 155 lbs. Apprentice riders allowed 5 pounds. **Approximately 1 1/8 miles on the Turf.**
- **RACE 12 – THE KATHEE RENGERT MEMORIAL APPRENTICE RIDER FLAT RACE – Apprentice Rider Flat. For Riders who have won fewer than 15 races over fences.** Post time 3:30 PM. Three Year Olds, 150 lbs.; Four Year Olds and Up, 155 lbs. Riders who have never won a race allowed 5 pounds. **Approximately 7/8 mile on the Turf.**

**RACE 1 – SMALL PONY RACE** – Open to Ponies 12.2 hands and under. Children under 13 years of age as of January 1, 2026. About ¼ mile on the flat. **Post time 12:00 Noon**

**RACE 2 – MEDIUM PONY RACE** – Open to ponies 12.2 to 13.2 hands. Children under 16 years of age as of January 1, 2026. This race will run immediately following the Small Pony Flat. Trophy and prize to the winner. About ½ mile on the flat. **Post time 12:30 PM**

**RACE 3 - LARGE PONY RACE** – Open to ponies 13.2 to 14.2 hands. Children under 16 years of age as of January 1, 2026. This race will run immediately following the Medium Pony Flat. Trophy and prize to the winner. About ¾ mile on the flat. **Post time 12:45 PM**

**RACE 4 – LEAD LINE PONY RACE** - For ponies ridden by juniors who have not reached their 7<sup>th</sup> birthday as of the 1<sup>st</sup> of the year. All ponies must have a lead line attached to their bridle and must be accompanied by an adult. About 50 yds. Walk or trot; entries breaking from trot must go behind the last entry in the field before continuing or may be Disqualified. Riders must wear ASTM approved helmets. Overgirths and protective vests are highly encouraged. Racing silks encouraged, riding attire accepted. **Post time 1:00 PM**

## **RACE 5 – LADIES RACE – THE BETTY BALDWIN MEISTER MEMORIAL**

Open to all horses and lady riders with a minimum weight of 150 lbs. Approximately three miles. **Post time 1:45**

## **RACE 6 – AMATEUR APPRENTICE RACE – THE JOSEPH T. MURTAGH MEMORIAL**

To be ridden by amateur apprentice riders. Riders must have reached their 16<sup>th</sup> birthday by the date of the race. Weight 160 lbs. Horses that have won a sanctioned race, add 5 lbs. Approximately three miles. **Post time 2:15pm**

## **NOVICE RACE – THE HENRY LATROBE ROOSEVELT MEMORIAL TROPHY**

Open to horses that have never won over timber prior to 1/1/2026. Open to all riders, minimum weight 160 lbs. Approximately three miles. **Post time 2:45pm**

## **RACE 8 – OPEN RACE – THE HENRY C. BALDWIN CHALLENGE TROPHY**

Open to all horses and riders with a minimum weight of 160 lbs. **Post time 3:15pm**

## **RACE 9 – Side Saddle Chase**

About 1 mile over fair hunting country. **Post time 3:45pm**

### Notes:

1. Absolutely no schooling permitted
2. NO rider allowances are given
3. All horses and riders must be acceptable to the committee.
4. Horses/ponies must be checked in at the paddock no later than one hour prior to the post time listed on the overnight of the first race in which they are entered, or they will be scratched. This will be strictly enforced.

5. The Race Committee reserves the right to split, combine, change the order and times of races, add or cancel any race. If races are combined, they will run at the higher weight of the combined races.
6. Current Coggins tests are required and must be available on race day.
7. Coggins must be presented and payment made to the racing secretary in order to receive a saddle towel on race day.
8. Riders must wear either regular hunting attire or racing silks, unless otherwise noted. Protective vests, over-girths, and NSA-approved helmets with chinstraps are MANDATORY in all races.

### Radnor Hunt Races Pony Races – Saturday May 16, 2026

Entries open Wednesday May 6 at **Central Entry Office**.

Entries CLOSE on Monday May 11 at noon.

Entry fee \$25 per horse for each race

**Race 1: Pony Parade:** For child riders and ponies interested in opening the day with a leisurely walk around on the track. **Entries will be collected starting at 9:00 AM on race day (not on CEO).**

**Race 2: Lead Line Trot Division 1:** For child riders requiring a supporting adult on the off side as well as a leading adult, on well-behaved mounts that are at least five years old. Walk and trot only. Approximately 30 yards.

**Race 3: Lead Line Trot Division 2:** For child riders with an adult leader, on well-behaved mounts that are at least five years old. Walk and trot only. Approximately 30 yards.

**Race 4: Junior Flat Race - Beginner:** Open to jockeys who have not reached their 16th birthday as of the 1st of the year, who have never won a race, on ponies who have also never won a race.

**Race 5: Junior Flat Race - Small Pony:** For small ponies (up to 13hh), ridden by jockeys who have not reached their 16th birthday as of the 1st of the year. Approximately 1 to 2 furlongs, exact distance to be determined on the day according to assessment of entries.

**Race 6: Junior Flat Race - Large Pony:** For large ponies (13hh - 14.2hh), ridden by jockeys who have not reached their 16th birthday as of the 1st of the year. Approximately 2 - 4 furlongs, exact distance to be determined on the day according to assessment of entries.

**Race 7: Junior Flat Race - Horse:** For horses (over 14.2hh), ridden by jockeys who have not reached their 16th birthday as of the 1st of the year. Approximately 2 - 4 furlongs, exact distance to be determined on the day according to assessment of entries.

- Pony Parade is a non-competitive, leisurely walk around the home stretch. The goal is to showcase the ponies and youngest jockeys in a relaxed and enjoyable manner. Open to all ponies and riders meeting the event's safety requirements, but riders may not cross enter in other races. Riders must be led by an adult handler. All participants must maintain a walking pace. All riders must wear approved helmets. Jockeys and ponies are encouraged to wear fun, festive attire that is safe and comfortable. Saddle towels provided for the first 30 entries. Entries will be collected starting at 9:00 AM on race day (not on CEO).
- Lead line races are open to riders on well-behaved mounts at least 5 years of age. The race will be in the stretch to the wire. Mounts may trot or walk. In the interest of fairness and safety for all involved, ponies breaking into a canter for more than two consecutive strides must slow down and place themselves behind the last placed competitor before resuming the race. Failure to do so will result being placed behind all others who complete the course in a trot. No whips, blinkers, or spurs. Riders that are not able to post or ride on their own may have an assistant on the far side of the pony for Division 1. Placing of entry will be determined by placing judges based on which pony's nose crosses the line first. Leaders must be adults. Entries exhibiting any unsportsmanlike-like conduct will be excused. Riders competing in leadline may not also compete in non leadline races.
- Junior races are open to juniors who have not reached their 16th birthday as of the first of the current year. Mounts to be a minimum of five years old. Catch weights. Small ponies will be defined as under 13hh. Large ponies will be defined as 13hh to 14.2 hh. Riders and ponies must be deemed acceptable to the committee. All horses, ponies and humans are subject to being scratched by race officials if they are unruly.
- In the event of small fields, races may be combined and run together if deemed advisable.
- Entries for all races are required to wear approved helmets.
- Overgirths and safety vests are REQUIRED for all non leadline races.
- Neck straps, safety vests and safety stirrups are encouraged for ALL races.
- Prizes for winners and best turned out.
